# Program

Lisa Reese announced our speaker and presenter John Dale, who along with his wife, Beata Dale own Shark Tooth Distillery.

I found a very informative article in the Sarasota Herald Tribune from April 7th. I encourage everyone to Google "Shark Tooth Distillery" and to read that article. John gave us a brief history of what started out as a hobby to create something and to have fun doing. John admits, that he knew nothing about distilleries, but their idea went from concept to shelves in 8 months.

They called around to 15 distilleries, and then got lucky and help from Steve Milligan and family who own Loaded Cannon Distillery in Lakewood Ranch. With their help, they were able to have 540 bottles ready for their first tasting held at Island Time Spirits on April 10th from 2 to 5 PM. Normally a good day is selling 35 bottles, they sold 360 bottles to 200 people. John said that he was lucky and loves his new town of Venice. Eventually their goal is to open a distillery in Venice with a restaurant that overlooks the distillery through a glass wall. A gift shop will be added soon

as well.

John briefly described their process of making vodka from corn which is mashed up with 3 yeasts. The mash is transferred to a still and filtered, then mashed again and filtered again, 17 times in total.

They hope to soon be producing a potato vodka which is so popular especially among Polish people. They want to eventually add flavors as well. First, probably orange, the lime and lemon.

John was very strong in his gratitude for a 70-year-old person of German descent who had been involved as a local distributor for over 40 years. Georg Pitthan had wanted to at least semi-retire from A-N-T Wines, Inc. He not only did he own the license, but also warehouse space, 4 trucks, and a great many contacts. Along came John and Beata and Georg said "It is yours". Georg continues to help

In conclusion, John talked about how he wants to give back to Venice and to honor new traditions. We cheered their success as we enjoyed a taste of his smooth yet tasty and clean vodka.
